S3IDF partners with collectives to enable small and marginal farmers' access to processing technology, financial literacy training, and formal working capital, each of which allows farmers to become better stewards of their land while increasing their incomes and strengthening their livelihoods. We assist farmers in transitioning to organic compost, purchasing equipment that reduces crop waste and raises income, and selecting crops for cultivation that make sense for the region in terms of natural heat tolerance and water use. Additionally, we promote new market linkages by facilitating public-private partnerships to enhance value chains


