S3IDF provides waste entrepreneurs with financial literacy training, facilitated loan guarantees and business mentorship to enable their financial inclusion. Our hands-on engagement provides waste entrepreneurs with critical insight into the formal banking system & the livelihood strengthening schemes available to them. Additionally, S3IDF offers entrepreneurs' access to technology, asset ownership opportunities, and training on the technological equipment necessary to best serve their communities. Through implementing multi-stakeholder collaborations, S3IDF catalyzes a more sustainable, integrated dry (plastics, paper, glass) and wet waste (food scraps), and septage management system. S3IDF is empaneled by the government's NSKFDC in recognition of the replication value of our particular waste worker livelihood strengthening approach.


